Salina Region SCCA February 9, 2014, meeting was called to order by R.E. Bill Preheim at 5:05 p.m. at Martinelli's Little Italy, Salina, Ks. Board members present were Rocky Entriken, Artt Mann (arrived at 5:15), Connie & Bill Preheim, Monte Rans, Dennis & Nancy Smith, Bill Dayton, Abner Perney (arrived at 5:17) and Ken Kennedy. Guests-Sandy Entriken and Christine Rans. Other guests joined later for the banquet scheduled for 7:00 p.m.

The January 11, 2014, minutes were presented. Motion to approve, Connie; second, Bill D. Passed 8-0 (Artt & Abner absent). The treasurer's report was presented and approved. Motion to approve, Rocky; second, Bill D. Passed 10-0. Bill D. reported that 2014 budget planning is in process.

<u>Old Business</u> - <u>Trailer Insurance</u> - Dennis reported currently the trailer and contents are not insured. An inventory is being prepared for the contents and insurance will be considered later. The exception is for people who have moved out of the area or live far away. Below is the list of those to whom we owe awards. A name with a ² or ³ by it means that person has more than one



Sometime in the autumn of 1989 there was a meeting at the Salina Chamber of Commerce office at which it was decided to take the barely 2-year-old Salina Chapter of Wichita Region and form our own SCCA Region.

The *Write Line* of the day made no mention of the process. No minutes of the meeting or anything, just suddenly notations in the Nov. 15, 1989, issue "that Salina Chapter

is about to become a region."
There was a report in the same issue of the Midwest Division
Convention in Springfield,
Mo., at which Wichita Region
RE Bruce Bettinger offered a motion "to permit the incipient

Salina Region to have a vote," the offer declined both because it would have meant suspending MiDiv bylaws and

the not-yet-a-region had yet to

pay its first MiDiv dues. But in so doing, Salina was welcomed to MiDiv.

As I recall that meeting at the chamber office, after some discussion I made the motion to form the region and Abner seconded it. Twenty-five years later here we are.

Salina Region's early years were marked by being the host region of the SCCA Solo II Nationals (the term lost its "II" in 2005). The Nationals were first in Salina in 1975 under Kansas Region aegis, returned in 1980-81 and 1983-84 with Kansas City Region running the show, and stayed through 1994. the National Office had taken over the organization of the event in 1986, with event chairs and specialty chiefs being drawn from across the nation. Nonetheless, the local host region was responsible for coordinating a number of items and one reason for forming the region was clearer lines of communications in doing so.

It may also be acknowledged that Salina Region likely would not exist but for the presence of the East Crawford Recreation Area and the solid support of the City of Salina and the Salina Parks & Recreation Department. We have worked well with the Parks & Rec leaders -- originally Don Jolley, then Steve Snyder (no relation to Salina Region's first Regional Executive, also named Steve Snyder), and now Dion Louthan.

There was the year they extended the airport taxiway south to Magnolia and opened it up for through transit as Markley Road, which happened just days before our annual Mirror Khana. At that time a portion of the course went out on the taxiway. Jolley, called in a panic that Saturday morning, had road barriers in place within two hours and shut the road down – telling us it would be the only time

he could get away with that because of an

agreement with Saline County to keep the road always open. But after the event we were able to go to the Saline County Commission and get "grandfathered" to close the road for the next several years. We abandoned the Markley Road portion when the Flor de Sol housing development was built – it's only access was right at the

flat-out lane shift!

neighbors. Never a peep out of them about our noisy activity. It's been learned the developer insulated the houses extremely well.

After 15 years in Salina – six years at ECRA and then nine more by the "Big Bertha" hangar (used to be Beechcraft) at the Salina Municipal Airport, Nationals outgrew Salina and moved to Topeka. The event remained in the Kansas capital for 14 years before going to its current site at Nebraska's Lincoln Airpark. Salina is still The Host The Most, at least until 2024 if Lincoln keeps it until then.

We've also done events at Central Mall, and more recently we've reached out to Ft. Riley, taking our sport to the soldiers there to do events at Marshall Field. We're a small region with a big reach and alumni spread across the nation and around the globe – Hawaii, Carolina, Chicago, Germany, Iraq and Afghanistan. We've brought collegiate FSAE teams here from KU, K-State, Wichita State, Pittsburg State, and from Missouri, Oklahoma, Iowa and Colorado. We've sent 19 Region-of-Record trophy-winning drivers to Nationals (no champions yet). That's 75th out of 119 SCCA Regions, and not counting many more who were associate members. We've brought the Midwest's best here for several MiDiv Championship events. We've even had a couple of MiDiv road racing champions. What's next?

SCCA Celebrates 70 Years Of Greatness — So Far

TOPEKA, Kan. (February 26, 2014) – The world was locked in a war that wouldn't officially end for another 18 months; the average car cost \$1,220, if you could find one currently being produced; a house averaged \$8,600, bread was nine cents a loaf, and minimum wage was 30 cents per hour. It was a different place, 70 years ago today, when seven sports car enthusiasts met at the Boston, Mass., home of Chapin Wallour on February 26, 1944, to form a club dedicated to the preservation of sports cars.

They may not have known it at the time, but the birth of the Sports Car Club of America that evening changed the face of motorsports, and – in the minds of many race fans today – the world.

The first meeting of the SCCA was a bit more exclusive than

today's members would recognize. The list of cars owned by founding members Everett Dickinson, John Duby, Arnold Engborg,

Theodore Robertson, George Schulz, Robert Townsend, and Chapin Wallour sound like museum pieces today: a

Those humble beginnings would grow to today's 60,000-member club, hosting events around the country and helping to launch legends including Mark Donohue, Jim Hall, Skip Barber,

The recent rallying cry of the Club, members to "make it easy, make it fun," may have turned the stomachs of the early members. The constitution drawn up by Ted Robertson stated that membership in the Club shall be restricted to owners of sports cars, sponsored by one current member, seconded by another, and elected by unanimous vote of the officers. Then, that new member must pay the yearly dues within 30 days – three dollars.

No matter their intentions, there's little doubt that today's SCCA is a better place. It's hard to imagine that the founders wouldn't look out at the nearly 1,200 competitors at the Tire Rack Solo National Championships in Lincoln, or the more than 700 competitors at last year's SCCA National Championship Runoffs in awe and smile at their accomplishments.

While the Sports Car Club of America stands on the shoulders of these giants, the next 70 years might be even more impressive.

Youngsters like 17-year-old Peter Portante, 2013's Formula Continental champion at the Runoffs, Amanda Hahn, the 17-year-old B-Street Prepared Ladies Solo National Champion, and 22-year-old Solo Driver of the Year Tom O'Gorman continue to set the groundwork for the SCCA's future – and they're not alone. Each SCCA event continues to showcase the next generation's stars, many of whom already beginning to take that leap toward Hall of Fame status.

The founding members laid the building blocks for the current version of the Club, as has every passionate member along the way. The building blocks continue to grow today.

Today, SCCA members will deservedly pat themselves on the back for an impressive accomplishment – many clubs, businesses, products and organizations have come and gone in 70 years. Next weekend, those same members will get together at the SCCA National Convention to discuss the plan for the immediate future and the next 70 years, because that passion isn't any less today than it was in Boston in 1944.

Specialty Training at Heartland Park

Not some lame fan screaming for an autograph, you're who drivers depend on to make the race happen, get them on the track, chart their progress, maybe even save their butt when it all goes wrong.

You're flaggers, timers, grid workers, starters. You run sound control or hospitality or registration or tech inspection.

Learn how – no charge – March 15 at Heartland Park Topeka. It's the Kaw Valley Race Group's Crash, Fire and Rescue School, and Specialty Training. Open to anyone, member or no.

You get the goods that make you a valued member of the officials' cadre at any race. Salina Region is indeed fortunate in that we have four tracks within a 3½-hour drive. That's 40% of the MiDiv racing schedule, close enough to spend the weekend and be home before sundown Sunday.

Or, A chance to try, on the cheap... Actual On-Track Racing!

On April 26/27, the St. Louis Region will host a drivers school, Regional club race, and PDX weekend at Gateway Motorsports Park that will also include our third "CLUB RACE EXPERIENCE."

What is Club Race Experience? It is a pilot program approved by SCCA. As the name implies it is a chance to "experience" a club race, in a (low horsepower) race car but *without* the racing license, *without* a physical, *without* a current annual tech on the race car. It is a way to experience Club Racing without all of the barriers to go racing.

In simple terms, the CRE drivers sign a form agreeing that they are in good health and that they will agree to very strict rules of the road, similar to driving standards at very restrictive vintage events. The CRE chief steward or the CRE chief instructor can and will talk to any driver who deviates from completely safe driving (aggressive driving, spins, two wheels off, hitting a marker cone, etc).

We start with drive arounds (similar to drivers school) that include paddock to pits; pits to the race track; on the race track, including where to go and where not to go; exiting the track into pit lane; where to service in the pits; and how to exit back into the paddock. The CRE will see a qualifying session and a race session, just like a Club Race.

Some CRE drivers may not even be SCCA members. Weekend memberships will suffice for CRE.

Typical CRE cars are Spec Miata; FProd; GProd; HProd; GTLite; ITA/B/C and others of similar speed [No V8s, no formula cars]. Cars are allowed to compete without an annual inspection and without a logbook, but safety is checked in tech. All good information the region needs to know.

SCCA Membership notes:

The categories of SCCA membership are somewhat confusing. In order to be eligible for all the programs of SCCA you need to be a National member, which includes a "local" region of your choice. This becomes your Region of Record.

Normally your R.o.R. is the area in which you live, but it doesn't have to be. We have members who live in other Regions' territories, and some of those regions have members who live in our territory.

You may also join as many other regions as you like, paying their local dues for the purpose of winning local championship points, receiving newsletters and participating in their programs. These are "associate," "dual" or "secondary" memberships.

The final option is to simply pay local region dues, in which case you are merely a newsletter subscriber, and not eligible for Regional awards, Divisional points or to compete in major SCCA events.

Associate memberships are due now for the year 2014.

Associate memberships are for the calendar year provided your National membership is active. Join now, and your membership begins immediately and runs through 2014. Dues are \$15.00 for single memberships or family memberships (which includes spouse). Subscriptions are available for non-SCCA members also at \$15.00 per calendar year. A code in the corner of your mailing label indicates status. A date (such as 10-14) indicates a Region-of-Record member expiring at the end of that month. A code such as A14 or FA14 indicates an Associate Member expiring at the end of that year. A Month indicates a non-member who ran with us at that event or asked for a newsletter. Other codes refer to complimentary copies sent this year

You <u>must</u> be a member to enter SCCA events. There are several different types of membership available, including Regular, Family, First Gear (under 25) and Military, plus short-term Weekend Memberships (we charge \$5).
