Having been to Lincoln for a Divisional Championship event earlier I had some idea of the expanse of the place and it was suggested to bring a bicycle. Well that was too much of a hassle so I didn't. Bad mistake. I put almost 110,000 steps on my pedometer in the five days I was there, that comes to just over 57 miles.

Registration was uneventful. I had to stand in line for half an hour but that gave me time to talk to some of the others there. Paddock seemed to be a free-for-all but I was able to get parked and unloaded in a reasonable amount of time. I was able to meet up with some fellow Salina region members who had been there earlier and they were very helpful in showing me where tech was located and other necessary things to do.

After all preliminaries were completed the exploring begun, going to the courses, looking at all the cars already there, and being in awe of the vastness of the site. About every night there was something going on. Monday night welcoming, Tuesday night Mazda dinner, on Wednesday was the Honda America Racing Team lunch and first banquet, finally Friday was the last banquet. Of course there was the competition happening from 8:00 a.m. until approximately 4:00 p.m. every day so it was fun just to go and watch some of the other classes.

I went to Nationals with very little expectation except to take in as much as possible. The first two days I met a lot of very nice and interesting people, names I had heard of before and several I had not. It was fun to compare notes with others in my class but quickly found there were things they would not share. I was also able to learn a lot about my own car from talking to people in my class. After two days of competition, one day of good weather and one in a monsoon, I was shown just how much I have to learn about driving at that level but was able to make my goal of "not be last" in my class.

So, would I go back? Yes! Would I recommend it to others? Very much so, even if it is only to watch but driving on that scale of a course is an experience everyone should do at least once. I had a great time and hope to be able to do it again and next time I will have my bike!

On a more local note remember our next event is Octoberfast and it is free to all Salina Region members, so get those memberships in and come join the fun for free! 
New Business – <u>Elections</u> – Nominations will be accepted in October. Need Solo Chair, Secretary and Treasurer.



The Wrath Of Khana

On the 50th anniversary of the Star Trek franchise, September's solo, chaired by Clint Holmes, was used as a test for a possible revision of our Mirror Khana course, necessitated both by the Barkley Park dog park and the fact cars are just getting faster. Two elements between the right-left "Hammer" turns and the MK finish lines worked well, but while the westward shift of the slalom was good, compressing the south-end turns wasn't. A likely solution may be to run the slalom diagonally to the east, and push the south end a bit further south to restore the character of its elements.

A super entry of 51 cars produced great competition, especially in the eight-car ES class and seven in STO6. The top 4 in ES were separated by only 0.667 sec, won by Randy Puls by 0.075 sec after Rocky Entriken coned his best run. STO6, the duel of the hyphens, saw Trenton Kent-Hardeman only 0.224 ahead of Suzanne Scott-Holmes.

Even Fast Lady was a close challenge (and, apologies, we gave the pink pylon to the wrong driver). Natasha Bergevine, running a Subaru WRX in the open DS class, was only 0.463 quicker than Jessica Green's CAM-CL Corvette, and Ann LaRandeau's FSL Mustang was only another 0.022 behind.

I am a full-time working mom in a relatively fast-paced job with not-so-fastpaced driving skills.

My first full season of autocross was in 2012, driving a D Stock 2003 Mini Cooper S on street tires (D Street wasn't a thing yet). In 2013,

I bought an autocross-ready 2008 Mini Cooper S from Craig Wilcox, so I could no longer blame the car for my failures. I also inherited some BFGs, and codrove in D Stock with Wiley Cox, who is one of the best, most helpful, and all around awesome co-drivers.

In 2014, I started the season late, after giving birth to my son, MJ, in May. My husband, Todd, was driving my brother PJ's famous (infamous?) Nissan 240SX named "Panda," in Street Modified for the year. For Nationals, I decided I didn't have the energy to bring the Mini out, and PJ graciously offered me a seat in Panda. And so I went from a D Stock Mini to a Street Mod Panda. Needless to say, it was a big leap, and on top of learning to drive RWD with tons of power, I was learning to be a mom.

I plan to use this page to share my thoughts on my own personal progress as a not-so-new autocrosser and also my attempt to groom my child into a champion junior karter turned driver. I mean, my attempt to be a mom to my child who can do whatever he wants to do when he grows up.

### **AUTOCROSS: BEFORE AND AFTER BABY**

The following comparisons assume that I bring the baby to the event. I have a debate with myself before every event about bringing him, but I'll save that for another post.

1. *Eat/Sleep/Autocross becomes Eat/Parent/Autocross* – I realized it was appropriate to replace sleep. Because what is sleep? I don't think I need to say much about this one.

Anyone who is a parent knows that you don't sleep, at least not like you used to, once you have a baby. I'm not really sure what happens as the baby gets older, but I'm optimistic that I'll sleep again someday. Also, my baby seems to have a sixth sense and almost always wakes up at least once in the middle of the night when I have to be up early the next morning. According to my FitBit, I got a whopping 3 hours and 27 minutes of sleep before heading to New Jersey for a ProSolo.

2. *The night before an event* – **Before baby**: grab your

helmet, GoPro, lots of water, sunblock, and maybe some snacks and/or a packed lunch.

After baby: all of that, plus milk, ice packs and cooler, food for the baby, baby sunblock, stroller, toys, blanket, tent, hat, baby wearing wrap, extra nipples if the baby is still on a bottle (because how

many times have I left the house with bottles of milk and no nipples?), cleaning supplies for the dirty nipples (although how many times have I actually cleaned the nipples after the baby finished his bottle?), bibs, washcloths, diapers, wipes, extra clothes for when he gets dirty, pajamas for the ride home if it's going to be late, and probably some other things I don't remember right now. When MJ was less than a year old, I was still nursing, which meant making sure the pump was charged, bringing enough bottles or bags for storage, cooler packs, and pumping accessories. Just make sure you tell an ops steward you need to run out and get someone to cover your work shift if you aren't back in time.

3. *Onsite car prep* – **Before baby**: empty car, change tires, adjust shocks, check tire pressures, add air if necessary, set up GoPro, put numbers on car, head

to grid. **After baby**: make sure baby has breakfast, change diaper, put sunblock on baby, hand baby off to someone who isn't driving the same heat, head to grid ... Okay, so I suppose I can still help with car stuff, but if I'm not busy chasing the baby around, I'm just too tired to do anything else. See #1.

- 4. Walk course **Before baby**: walk with co-driver, analyze the course, identify key cones, plan your lines, discuss braking zones, other stuff that good drivers do. **After baby**: figure out where the start is, push the stroller around course, tend to baby if he gets cranky, chit chat with whoever decided to give up a serious coursewalk and walk with me, find the finish.
- 5. Drive **Before baby**: think about the plan you created on the coursewalk, drive it! **After baby**: stay awake! See #1 again. Looking at my ProSolo reaction times before and after baby, I may have actually been asleep at the wheel.
- 6. *Pack up* **Before baby**: change tires and adjust shocks, pack up, hang out, and wait for trophies. **After baby**: consider leaving early if you have the last heat off. You probably don't get to stay for trophies even if you miraculously win your class.

### SCCA Membership notes:

You may also join as many other regions as you like, paying their local dues for the purpose of winning local championship points, receiving newsletters and participating in their programs. These are "associate," "dual" or "secondary" memberships.

The final option is to simply pay local region dues, in which case you are merely a newsletter subscriber, and not eligible for Regional awards, Divisional points or to compete in major SCCA events.

- A code in the corner of your mailing label indicates status. A date (such as 09-16) indicates a Region-of-Record member expiring at the end of that month. A code such as A16 or FA16 indicates an Associate Member expiring at the end of that year. A month indicates a non-member who ran with us at a recent event or asked for a newsletter. Other codes refer to complimentary copies being sent this year.

If you live in Manhattan, Ft. Riley or Junction City and have enjoyed competing in or attending our events, we'd love to have you become a member of our happy little club.
