

## 7 things performance drivers Do with their brake pedal

- 1. They squeeze the pedal quickly, applying hard initial pressure; then as the car slows they progressively release pressure through the brake zone.
- 2. They time the start of releasing the pedal, managing the rate of release to help the car carry corner entry speed.
- 3. With a non-ABS car, if the brakes lock up, they release just enough pressure by curling their toes back from the pedal, which allows the front tires to resume rotating and thus regaining steering control.
- 4. With an ABS-equipped car, they learn whether activating the ABS is good or bad, and keep the system right at that point.
- 5. When faced with a fast corner that requires a minor speed or balance adjustment, they experiment with a slight brush of the brakes with their left foot.
- 6. If right-foot braking and heel & toe downshifting, they keep consistent pressure on the pedal while blipping the throttle
- 7. If left-foot braking, they practice constantly to develop and fine-tune modulating the pedal smoothly.

## SCCA dues, fees revised

## Memberships bump \$5 each

**TOPEKA, Kan. (Jan. 3, 2017)** – The SCCA Board of Directors has finalized its 2017 fee structure for dues, sanctions and insurance. The BoD approved the changes during its December meeting.

Of note is a small \$5 increase in dues for both regular and weekend members. Lee Hill, the new SCCA Board of Directors Chairman, said the revised membership fee will go into effect March 1, 2017.

"Raising prices is never popular, but in preparing the budget for 2017 it became obvious that some increases were going to be required in order to maintain balance," Hill said. "The slight membership increase applies to both regular and weekend memberships, and is the first increase in eight years. The decision to change dues was not taken lightly, but was felt to be the most effective and equitable avenue available."

The new membership dues structure is accompanied by a new membership application form (*see Pg. 6*) which reflects a "generic" dues structure applying to all new memberships. The "generic" dues encompass both National and Regional dues and approximates Regional dues of \$15, which just happens to be Salina Region's dues for both individual and family memberships. Regions will receive their normal dues assessment for individual and family memberships, and \$10 for First Gear (under 25) memberships which is exactly the same as before.

Membership renewals will reflect the same \$5 increase, which can be offset by credits for volunteering as race workers and for recommending new members

For insurance purposes, all competitors and anyone in a "hot zone" must have at least a weekend membership. Regions formerly were assessed \$5 for each competitor weekend membership, which rate has also been bumped \$5 making the regions' cost \$10 now. Weekend memberships for non-competitors – race workers, solo ride-alongs, etc. – remain free of charge.

Sanction and Insurance fees were also finalized. For solo events, the sanction fee remains at \$6.50 per entrant, while the insurance fee is raised 50¢ to also stand at \$6.50.




#### MORE AUTOCROSS LESSONS LEARNED

#### By Jojo Corrales-Kean New England Region

- **1.** The addiction I honestly don't know what's more addictive, autocross or baby wearing (although by "baby wearing" I mean buying stuff for baby wearing). The following sentences have actually come out of my mouth:
- "I'm not going to autocross."
- "I'm not going to put money into my car just for autocross."
- "I'm not going to buy a car just for autocross."
- "I'm not going to spend that much on a wrap."
- "I'm not going to spend that much again on a wrap."

• "I'll sell this wrap." (No, have not yet sold any wraps.)

My first year of autocross I did maybe two or three events, and the NER rookie school. My second year of autocross, I think I went to *seven* national events, plus almost all of the locals for two clubs. When my friend





told me to let her know if I was interested in baby wearing, I thought to myself, "I have a Bjorn, I'm good." But things have escalated since then. Now that I am love with wrapping and Tulas, I am even thinking of becoming an educator for one of the local baby wearing groups.

- 2. The learning curve The first time I watched an autocross, and the first time I saw someone do a back carry, my response was the same. "That looks complicated." At this point, I can navigate an autocross course pretty well, just maybe not as fast as some other drivers. I can also get the baby pretty secure in some fairly advanced back carries, just maybe not as fast as some other wrappers. The process was the same. Understand the basics, watch lots of video, get help from instructors, and practice, practice, practice. For both autocross and baby wearing, I have been approached to be an instructor, and that's just flattering.
- **3.** The language I won't be surprised if my kid says "DSP" or "SSC" before he says "ABC." Both the autocross and baby wearing worlds have their own languages filled with acronyms. My family runs with SCCA, and have competed in SM, SSM, XP, DSP, DS, STU, and I don't even know what else. I've also spent lots of PPD on JoJ,

JKC, JKO, SN and an SSC.

- **4. It's never too early to find a co-driver** This has nothing to do with my driving, but is just too adorable to not mention.
- 5. Make sure you fit and are secure in the seat After Day 1, I realized I was bracing myself really hard with my left leg, and my co-driver noticed on my videos that my left leg was all



over the place. On Day 2, I tried a chest strap to help hold

me into the seat. We may want to install a real harness as this is an issue for both of us. MJ does NOT fit into a seat quite yet, but we have a few years before we have to deal with that.

talked about quitting autocross a few times, but made the decision to keep trying. I wouldn't be able to do it without her. I'm also motivated by others who have commented on the fact that I'm still driving. Last year, I heard comments along the lines of:

- "It's so great to see you back so soon after the baby!"
- "You're an inspiration. We want to start a family soon, so it's awesome to see you keep driving."
- "Too many women stop after having babies, we need to encourage them to come back."

It's true that I started driving because I enjoyed spending time with my husband, my brother, and all of the friends I have made. But I am motivated to *keep* driving because of all of the support and inspiration I have received. So, support all the mommas!

#### SCCA Membership notes:

The categories of SCCA membership are somewhat confusing. In order to be eligible for all the programs of SCCA you need to be a National member, which includes a "local" region of your choice. This becomes your Region of Record.

Normally your R.o.R. is the area in which you live, but it doesn't have to be. We have members who live in other Regions' territories, and some of those regions have members who live in our territory.

You may also join as many other regions as you like, paying their local dues for the purpose of winning local championship points, receiving newsletters and participating in their programs. These are "Associate" memberships. Salina Region's Associate Members are eligible for all our championships and benefits.

The final option is to simply pay local region dues, in which case you are merely a newsletter subscriber, and not eligible for Regional awards, Divisional points or to compete in major SCCA events.

#### Associate memberships are due now for the year 2017 · · ·

- Associate memberships are for the calendar year provided your National membership is active. Join now, and your membership begins immediately and runs through 2017. Dues are \$15.00 for single memberships or for family memberships (which includes spouse).
- Subscriptions are available for non-SCCA members also at \$15.00 per calendar year. Please send a check payable to the Salina Region SCCA, c/o *The Write Line*, 2731 Scott Avenue, Salina, KS 67401.
- A code in the corner of your mailing label indicates status. A code like 09-17 indicates a Region-of-Record member expiring at the end of that month. A code such as A17 or FA17 indicates an Associate Member expiring at the end of that year. A month indicates someone not a member of Salina Region who ran with us at a recent event or asked for a newsletter. Other codes refer to complimentary copies being sent this year.

If you live in Manhattan, Ft. Riley or Junction City and have enjoyed competing in or attending our events, we'd love to have you become a member of our happy little club. If you should choose to join SCCA in our Region, be sure to use the membership form found in a Write Line or be sure to indicate "SALINA REGION" in the space above the signature. Geographically, Riley and Geary counties are in territory of our Kansas Region neighbors and SCCA will put you there if not told otherwise. Of course, once an SCCA member, you're welcome at any region's events. You'll find a listing of our neighboring regions' events in the "Events Elsewhere" calendar inside.



You <u>must</u> be a member to enter SCCA events. There are several different types of membership available, including Regular, Family, First Gear (under 25) and Military, plus short-term Weekend Memberships (we charge \$5).
