

Notice to Salina Region membership:

At the last board meeting (Sun., Aug. 27) changes were made to the Salina Region bylaws. A second change was made by email board vote in the following week (Wed., Aug 30). In accordance with those bylaws, the membership must be notified within 10 days of the change. Said notice was made by e-mail to all members who had e-mail addresses on file with SCCA.

If you did not receive the notice, either your address is not on file with SCCA or the address on file is incorrect. Anyone can log in to their membership page at www.scca.com and update their own membership information.

Essentially two basic changes were made (wording was revised on more than two specific bylaws to effect the change).

The first was to remove the requirement that Salina Region board members must be Region of Record members in Salina Region. This now opens the possibility an Associate Member may serve as a Salina Region board member. Heretofore Associate members (those whose region of record is elsewhere), enjoyed all rights and privileges of Salina Region membership except for that one item.

Art. II, Sec. 1b – replace the phrase "full voting rights" with "all rights and privileges the same as Region of Record members."

Art IV, Sec 2 – replace the sentence "Directors must be Salina Region of Record members" with "Directors must be current dues-paid Region of Record or Associate members of Salina Region."

The second was to add language on the procedure to become or maintain an Associate Membership, which required payment of dues directly to the region. It is now possible to pay associate member dues through SCCA with regular membership application or renewal, and the new language reflects that.

Art II, Sec. 4 – add the sentence "Or in the alternative, any Associate member paying region dues through SCCA with their regular membership renewal will have an Associate membership term concurrent with their national membership term."

Dan Rowland, a member of the Kansas State University Formula SAE Team, was course chair for the Aug. 27 event, setting up the course under a thunderstorm, but by the time it passed and preliminary activities (coursewalks, driver's meeting, etc.) a dry pavement awaited.

Rowland, however, had a dickens of a time just getting his own self out on his own course.

He rolled in towing K-State's Powercat Saber, the team's 2017 FSAE car, to run in the A Modified class, but it almost immediately developed issues. So he jumped into Artt Mann's '39 Ford Victoria dwarf car, which also was entered in AM. It's first attempt never even left the line, and the second didn't make it to the turnaround of the course – fuel pump issues.

So finally he turned to a more mundane ride, brother Mark's BMW 330Ci, in which he turned the five cars of D Street into the closest class of the event.

The course was surprisingly cone-happy – only seven of the 44 drivers escaped without a DNF or a pylon penalty. In DS, both Bill Dayton and Dan Rowland managed only one clean run, coincidentally the fourth try for each of them, and Dayton was quicker by 0.684 sec. In dirty runs Rowland's quickest was less than a tenth better than Dayton's quickest.

The largest class was E Street with seven cars, but in the end it was an intrafamily Gang Green go for the gold, young Joey Green outrunning dad James Green in the family Toyota MR2, leaving a quintet of Miatae in their wake. Joey's time of 43.421 sec also produced the top PAX of the event, edging out Mark Hill's 41.715 run in STU.

On the distaff side, ESL was a 3-car class, won by Fast Lady Sharon Brillhart at 48.062.

FTD went to a doorslammer, Brian Tefft's XP Miata at 40.631 – his only clean run. Radlee Bien had four runs below 40 sec in his F Mod Formula 500 but coned them all, and Tefft also coned two runs in the 39s.

The second-closest class of the day was F Prepared, two novices sharing a Toyota Corolla, and having nary a single off-course or cone down. Ryan Redenbaugh started at 61.5 and whittled down to a 57.4, while Toby Kottong did a 72 on his first time out but then cut huge chunks of time each run to end up at 58.3. Theirs was the only other class with a margin of less than one second.

Dennis Smith drew up a course full of slaloms, no two alike and each tougher than the one before.

The first was a long 90-foot job, outset but flat-out from the dead stop at the start, then some fast inline fencerows

feeding a couple of fast sweeps and another trio of fencerows before the tight turnaround. Patience began to set in for a long single-cone run, and then a full-throttle blast through two swerves led to the final run through cones spaced about 65 feet apart but because of the outset it drove more like 50-footers.

Only four drivers managed to break 50 sec, including FTD Radlee Bien with his FM Red Devil Formula 500 at 46.161; Junior A winner Mason Herrick (fresh from his third straight Nationals win) at 47.392 in just two runs, Fast Fender Brian Tefft Jr., with just a single 47.468 run in his XP Miata before its transmission quit transmitting, and Top PAX Mike Herrick at 47.940 in his STS Civic. Tefft also took Johnny Huang's STS Miata for some funruns and clocked a 49.7. Sharon Brillhart was Fast Lady with a 55.291 to win ESL.

Only one class finished with a victory margin of less than one second, that being STO4 – four different models of Hondas – where Michael Mace's S2000 came in 0.337 sec quicker than Austin McHenry's Del Sol.

Largest class was ES, six cars, topped by James Green's MR2, 1.273 quicker than Rocky Entriken's Miata.

#### ONLY TWO EVENTS LEFT TO QUALIFY IN REGION CHAMPIONSHIP

Two events remain in the 2017 Salina Region Solo Championship. To qualify a driver must be a member of Salina Region before Oct. 1 (indicated by a • in the list below), and have competed in at least four local events (indicated by *). Our Divisional and the Solo Nationals are extra "bonus" rounds not included in the local-event tally. Drivers score their best eight of 12 possible events.

A code has been added to the list below, with a small superscript ³ before the points total for members who need one more event to qualify, and a superscript ² for those who need both events to qualify. Only current members are so noted.

To win in Wild Car-d, a driver must have run in at least three different classes (indicated by †) while not qualifying in any single class.

The Write Line JUST IN APOUND —Abner Perney

I used to do a column for practically every issue. I recently awoke to the fact that I did exactly one this year, right after the awards banquet and that one was flawed. Rocky covered my bad memory last time I did an Idling column by noting that I had actually used 6 (not 5) different H Street cars during the 2016 season. He also included a history of the "Of The Year" awards back unto the beginning of the Chapter/Region. That reminded me of my other Driver of the Year award in 2007.

In that year I drove my G Stock Mazda Protégé and actually won events with other cars and drivers in my class. The coolest event of the year – make that of my car-driving lifetime thus far – was not even SCCA-sanctioned. It was the Sand Hills Open Road Challenge, a high speed rally with the object to complete the 55mile course exactly at a predetermined speed. I ran it in son Adam's 2002 Subaru WRX, while he was deployed to the Bush Wars. I was in the 90 mph class, which is the fastest allowed for street cars on street tires without roll bars or roll cages. The course is run north 29 miles from the edge of Arnold, Neb., to Nebraska Highway 2 on bumpy asphalt county roads with hills and curves, three of which are very slow, one 90° intersection is about 30 mph no matter how fast your car is, and two others are about 45°. The bulk of the rest are 80 to more than 100 mph. One trick of the 90 mph class is that you are not to exceed 120 mph, and at least the two longest straights are radar monitored to disqualify violators. At the end of the northbound run, you cruise over to the little town of Dunning for breakfast at the high school. On that fine day in August, there were more than 20 cars in the class and the winner was only .008 seconds off the perfect time! Surprisingly, I was second, only navigating by myself with a Garmin GPS, and trying to hold the Zen of 90 at 89.998 mph only two thousandths of a mile per hour off (.029 seconds)! This was the closest finish the organizers had ever seen in many years of organizing such events in Nevada, Texas and Nebraska.

The season is almost over! But, I shall review. March 18, with my new SA2015 helmet on board, I journeyed eastward in the predawn hours of the morn in order to find exit 24 on I-70 in Missouri, turned south into the town of Grain Valley, East on Old 40, to Grain Valley Speedway and the adjacent Sand Drag park where the KC Region conducted their first rallycross of the year. It was a dusty little affair, with 27 drivers, and I did my middling good enough in the morning session. At the lunch break, I was 14th or 13th overall. I had Stock FWD won as the only entrant. Was feeling pretty good. I was even ahead of a novice who had the brand new killer Focus RS factory Rally/Track/ Drift/Autocross Ford's Best Current Idea car. But first a few words for Paul Robinson and the KC region. They really put on a fun laid back event, complete with free lunch!! Which was actually a gift of Mark Hill, the same known to participate in Salina region events. The other thing they do is put results on their website within a couple minutes of when it happens, and you can access them on your phone!

For those of you who haven't tried rallycross, here's the deal: It is like autocross on grass, dirt, mud, sand, but no stinking pavement! Due to the extremely poor traction normal for such surfaces, the classes are drastically simplified, just Stock Front, Rear and All Wheel Drive; Prepared F, R and A; Modified F, R,

and A. No separate Ladies classes. The major rule difference is that every run counts, cones are 2 seconds, missed gates are 10 seconds, and there are no DNF's unless a vehicle collapses and loses all self propulsion.

The fun things are that it is slower, and a lot more plowing or tail out sliding around. Oh! Some of the time you can't see the next gate because of the dust. If the course becomes too rough, they just change it, hopefully so that every direct competitor gets the same number of runs on every variant. To facilitate that, heats are defined by class. Back to Grain Valley. We had five runs in the morning, and five in the afternoon. What you notice is though you have some really respectable raw times, those cones really add up! Then if you are the world's most experienced novice, you can try really hard to go fast, catch more cones, and on the last run, seize DFL from the jaws of mediocrity, by plowing off course just before the finish, still catching a time, yet nearly crashing into the ditch, while going on the outside of the last gate and kicking a few more cones into the dust! That alone was 14 seconds penalty! We shall return!

At our Solo Test and Tune, my new wheels and 200 treadwear summer extreme tires, really worked well. On the slow tight Saturday test, where we got about 16 runs, I even beat John LaRandeau, which I have never done before even when I've had cars that should have been competitive with his. Was only 3/100s off the HS pace set by Don Herrick with his Fiesta ST. My best ever in comparison to him. On Sunday morning Rocky came up with a really challenging course, with features that looked a little different than anything I recall. It was fun and long in the wet first heat, and times improved dramatically for the dry second heat. It was a good day, but I half spun once and full spun once in the cool and damp. One halfway respectable clean run; but no trophy for me at the end of the day. It will be another interesting season, driving the only Coal/Wind/Nuclear/Natural Gas and a little Premium Pump Gasoline, powered solo car in the area: a Chevrolet Volt.

The year has progressed pretty much apace with that first event. I have been second to Don Herrick and his ST Fiesta, by nearly as bad a margin as last year when I drove the original equipment tires. My excuse is that his car weighs like a thousand pounds less and has 70 more gasoline produced turbo horsepower. But he may just be a lot better driver! So late in the season there's only one thing to do for a senior slacker, former Driver of the Year and perpetual novice with inappropriate cars and poor skills to do: Change class! My intent now is to prove my oft made allegation that there are so many classes available, that in a small region, all you have to do to be a Class Champion, is to pick a class where you have either no competitors at all, or you can, through consistency and luck, beat most of them. It only takes four events in a class to qualify – some folks have won two class championships in a single year playing this game.

So, Aug. 27, I switched to Street Touring Front Wheel Drive. My straight stock Volt is legal. I "won" that event. If I make the same class the last three events I stand a good chance of winning it for the season. I am currently tied with Brett Cook for second in the class. Tim Beach is first with two wins early in the year. Neither of them are Region members, so I am the points leader in the actual year end awards contest. If either, or both, join and show up next month it could be an actual competitive situation!

I also hope to enter two more regional rallycrosses and the SCCA Dirtfish Rallycross Nationals Oct. 20-22 at conveniently handy Heartland Park Topeka. Join me if you dare!

Stay off the intergalactic communicators on the road and Happy Trails to you. —Abner

SCCA Membership notes:

The categories of SCCA membership are somewhat confusing. In order to be eligible for all the programs of SCCA you need to be a National member, which includes a "local" region of your choice. This becomes your Region of Record.

Normally your R.o.R. is the area in which you live, but it doesn't have to be. We have members who live in other Regions' territories, and some of those regions have members who live in our territory.

You may also join as many other regions as you like, paying their local dues for the purpose of winning local championship points, receiving newsletters and participating in their programs. These are "Associate" memberships. Salina Region's Associate Members are eligible for all our championships and benefits.

The final option is to simply pay local region dues, in which case you are merely a newsletter subscriber, and not eligible for Regional awards, Divisional points or to compete in major SCCA events.

Associate memberships are due now for the year 2017 · · ·

- Associate memberships are for the calendar year provided your National membership is active. Join now, and your membership begins immediately and runs through 2017. Dues are \$15.00 for single memberships or for family memberships (which includes spouse).
- Subscriptions are available for non-SCCA members also at \$15.00 per calendar year. Please send a check payable to the Salina Region SCCA, c/o *The Write Line*, 2731 Scott Avenue, Salina, KS 67401.
- A code in the corner of your mailing label indicates status. A code like 09-17 indicates a Region-of-Record member expiring at the end of that month. A code such as A17 or FA17 indicates an Associate Member expiring at the end of that year. A month indicates someone not a member of Salina Region who ran with us at a recent event or asked for a newsletter. Other codes refer to complimentary copies being sent this year.

If you live in Manhattan, Ft. Riley or Junction City and have enjoyed competing in or attending our events, we'd love to have you become a member of our happy little club.
