

The Salina Region SCCA board met Nov. 8, 2020, at Dean Evans Stadium. Monte
Rans, RE, called the meeting to order at 3:17 p.m. Attending were Rocky Entriken,
Hank Brillhart, Dennis and Nancy Smith, Theresa Walton, Aaron Loggan, Abner
Perney, Tim Thompson, Connie Preheim, and guests Sharon Brillhart, Bailey Martin
and Colton Maxwell. Dennis moved the minutes be approved and Hank seconded,
motion passed. There was no treasurer's report available.

Old Business – The new sound system was in use at the event and has been paid for. Mark and Theresa have volunteered to get the trailer this winter to rewire it to accommodate the new system and other electronics. Theresa suggested hanging helmets along the wall of the trailer to eliminate all of the totes. Rocky moved we authorize the updates. Dennis seconded, motion passed.

Rocky has ordered new helmets to be delivered in December or January. He also took the outdated ones and moved to offer them free of charge to whomever can use them. Dennis seconded, motion passed.

The new sound system has created a new learning curve to eliminate problems. The wind caused some problems at the event.

Axware update was brought up by Monte and he noted a hotspot will be needed for this. Dennis has received 6 chargers for the new radios.

New Business – Colton Maxwell and Bailey Martin have volunteered to run for Assistant RE and Secretary on the 2021 Salina Region board.

Monte has visited with a representative for the Pronto timing system and will get a demonstration scheduled for board members to view. Pronto is the system used by SCCA for major solo events, including Nationals.

Junior Karts have new requirements and may necessitate training for the Junior Driver steward. Events may need to have a modified junior kart course.

Weekend membership procedures: Nancy has been getting them completed. The September event memberships haven't been turned in yet.


Facebook: Artt Mann reported by email that Facebook's updates, which could affect the Salina Region pages, are still in progress.

How to get one?

- Log in at SCCA Com. Click your photo and "View Profile."
- Click "File Cabinet." Scroll down to Waivers, click
- "Annual Waiver Adult." The waiver comes up as a PDF document. Print it out in color.
- Fill out the form. be sure to fill in "2021" at the top.
- Don't sign it until you can do that with an SCCA official or a Notary to witness your signature. (Hint: "SCCA official" means anyone in charge of something – an event registrar, a Regional Executive, a safety steward, etc.)
- Send it in to SCCA Membership Dept. (USPS mail or scan it and e-mail it to membership@scca.com). Include a mugshot unless you already have one on your SCCA profile (a photo of YOU, not your car!). Hard Cards all expire on Dec. 31. If you get one after Oct. 1 it's good through the following year. It's valid as long as your membership is current.

If you have a car that was driven at the Runoffs by a four-or-more time SCCA National Champion, who won races in Trans-Am, finished on the podium at the 24 Hours of Le Mans and won a class at the 24 Hours At Daytona... AND won an Oscar for Best Actor? You may list said car on SCCA.com for sale.

With that in mind, consider this a listing of the 1979 C Production National Championship-winning Datsun 280ZX for sale on MotorCarClassics.com. This car was piloted by one Paul Newman (see, it fits the rules!) to six regular season wins that year, plus the Runoffs gold medal at Road Atlanta.

Octoberfast 31

We should call this one Octoberfroze. Barely above freezing when we started and by mid-afternoon it was colder. Nonetheless, 38 hardy souls came to run our annual Member Appreciation Event. Octoberfast seemed even faster this year although it is supposedly the same course every year. Well, maybe. It's the same course *map*, but how it is interpreted year to year ... your mileage may vary.

The course was designed by multi-time past REs (both of them did their turns) Dave and Jo Richards. It was a feature of Salina Region's first season in 1990 and has been replicated, more or less, every year since. This time the opening was a full-throttle dash to the "good" concrete, 3rd gear for smaller cars, shut down, grab 2nd gear, turn right, wide open slalom, shut down, turn right, go some more, and then the turnaround with that nasty little hook on the outside. Fast wiggle past the dog park, shut down, turn left this time, one more WOT blast, dance through the final slalom and Finish! 50-some seconds for everybody but the K-State kids in their Formula SAE cars.

FSAE results, with apologies, are not what was announced at the event. Seven drivers in two cars created some confusion (better car numbers would help *koff* *koff*) but the battle among the top three in KSU's new Caracal was fierce. Blaine Thiess and Devin Wright battled in the first heat with Wright eventually standing on a 2nd-run 46.856. In the second heat Vance Weber uncorked a threatening 47.042, but was DNF on run #2 and never got another, ending up 0.186 behind Wright.

The Powercats were four sec quicker than the fendered cars. Four drivers got down to 51s, with Aaron Logan's XSA Mercedes quickest at 51.096. That was only 0.060 sec quicker than Ron Williams' GS Civic, and 0.179 better than J.D. Baughman's SMF Cobalt. Also in the 51 range was Randy Pulls' BS 'Vette.

The largest class, ES, was also the tightest. The Wildcat crew put three drivers in a Toyota MR2 to challenge the father-son Team Tefft. Ultimately the trio became the meat in the sandwich. Brian Tefft, now in a Miata Sport (at least his third different car this year), got off a second-run 52.245. Dan Rowland answered with a third-run 52.251. Neither improved, ending up 0.006 apart.

Monte Rans and Don Herrick had a dandy duel in HS, Rans winning by 0.632 sec. In A Mod, Artt Mann brought his own assassin, giving R.J. Echols a ride in his Dwarf Car Ford Victoria. Echols won the class by 0.970 sec.

CONFONER VIRUS

Two weeks later for our finale, November weather was 40° warmer, but windy! Gusts of 35 mph or more brought the "coneover virus" and we had to double-stack them to minimize the wind blowing the pylons to Ottawa County. Hitting those suckers was **nasty**!

But never mind, Aaron Loggan drew a wowser of a course, fast and flowing. We had 44 drivers for one last blast before the cones and cars are put away for the winter.

The closest contest of the day was also the fastest – K Mod. Ron Williams left his GS Honda home, coming to play with a shifter kart. Waiting for him was Chad Stoughton with his silent electric screamer. Stoughton reeled off a consistent string of mid-44s while Williams started in the 47s but knocked off chunks of time in successive runs. Stoughton was first vehicle out and on his final run brought a home a 44.536. Williams, next-to-last on course, chased down a time of 44.456 – winning the class and FTD by 0.080 sec.

H Street was a similar battle. Russell Blume posted a string of 51s while Monte Rans bounced from 53 to 51 and back. Again it came to final runs, Blume bringing home a 51.394 to beat Rans by 0.483. Laney Blume was only another 0.109 back to take Fast Lady.

Only two fenders broke 50 sec, with Mike Herrick's STS-winning Civic posting 48.299 for Fast Fender and Top PAX. Only Frank Wietharn's SS-R Corvette was also below 50 at 49.1.

Randy Puls, in the late Jim Gillett's Corvette FRC, battled Robert Clapp's Camaro in CAM-S, Puls taking the win by 0.316 sec. In XSB Kale Morris topped Colton Maxwell by 0.977 in a Miata matchup.

Time Trials Nationals Becomes SCCA's Indy 500

How's it like the Indy 500? — Glad you asked. The simple answer is, with more than 200 participants, the event has become one of the premier events on the SCCA calendar, so it's moving to a spring date – June 9-13, 2021, to be exact – so it can be our big summer kick-off event, just like the Indy 500 is for IndyCar.

The not-so-simple answer? The Time Trials Program is Growing.

— In the three years since SCCA renewed focus on the dormant program, more than 2000 Time Trials licenses have been issued and 25 SCCA Regions are now hosting Time Trials events to introduce local drivers to the sport.

Time Trials Nationals, at NCM Motorsports Park in Bowling Green, KY, grew by more than 60% this year – from 130 competitors in 2019 to 212 who turned times in an otherwise challenging 2020.

On a National level, a concentrated Time Trials National Tour has

been formed for the first time in history, SCCA is now the sanctioning body for Global Time Attack, and the Club shared events with the professional-level Global Time Attack program in 2020.

And, we've learned some things. —

- 1. <u>The fall is EXTREMELY busy</u>. Solo Nationals, the Runoffs, partner schedules, staff bandwidth, publications—fall is jam-packed.
- 2. *Stickers are a dead giveaway* that Time Trials Nationals is drawing in members from other SCCA programs.
- The event needs room to grow. If Time Trials Nationals is going to grow – and there are some really nifty ideas floating around on how it could – it needs some room.

So, mark your calendar for June 9–13, because beginning in 2021, Time Trials Nationals will become the highest profile SCCA event in the first half of the year. That means even more growth and the opportunity for those who also want to participate in autocross or road racing championship events in the fall. —*Andrea Wolfe/SCCA*

What a year! What a weird, maddening, confusing, disrupting year! 2020 was supposed to be the year of "perfect vision," full of promise for fun and camaraderie among those of us of motorsport persuasion. Instead it quickly devolved into a morass of uncertainty and fear of a global pandemic.

Months of March and April, normally the beginning of the season replete with eagerness and hope, instead fell silent as the world shut down. Everything, it seemed, was cancelled. Basketball's March Madness (with KU's Jayhawks as the #1 team in the nation) and the NBA playoffs. Baseball never started. Golf lost the Masters. Hockey on hiatus. Motorsports fell silent – Formula 1, NASCAR, IndyCar, all parked. And grassroots with it – Salina Region lost its first two weekends in March and April, five events including our test & tune, season opener, April doubleheader, and Evolution School.

But then, using Gov. Kelly's COVID-19 guidelines and the generous assent of the City of Salina, we were approved for our scheduled May 9 autocross – a Saturday event because Sunday was Mother's Day.

We found out later it was the first SCCA Solo event to happen in the "lower 48" since the pandemic shutdown. Only an autocross by Arctic-Alaska Region a week earlier had preceded us nationwide.

SCCA saluted the restart with an article on scca.com. The photo below illustrated the article – our socially distanced drivers meeting.

In past years a 40-car event in Salina was a big turnout. Our Divisional would pull in the 60s. This year our opener had 49 cars, the Divisional four weeks later had 97. The annual challenge with Wichita Region became the three-region Sunflower Showdown, Kansas Region joining in, and ours was the largest of the three events at 76 cars.

We put on eight weekends, nine events scoring the

Divisional as a doubleheader for Region points, averaging 51.5 entries per weekend. Even taking the Divisional out of the equation, the average was 45 cars per event. Scoring the Wichita and Topeka rounds of the Showdown in our championship, our drivers had 11 events to go to.

Summertime saw F1, NASCAR and IndyCar putting together weird schedules to get in a season, doubleheaders, back-to-back races, midweek races. But they are the 900-pound gorillas of motorsport. Lesser events still felt the Coronavirus sting. Both nearby Kansas City and Ozark Mountain Regions lost their entire seasons because their college campus autocross sites were shut down. MiDiv's Solo Series, scheduled for five weekends (10 rounds), ended with only three weekends. MiDiv road racing lost four weekends. SCCA, in a grand accommodation to the pandemic, permitted drivers to "buy" entries to races they could not attend in order to meet Runoffs eligibility.

The Solo Nationals in Lincoln, Neb., were cancelled! Other SCCA championships were held because they were all at dedicated race tracks and could run in a "bubble," not possible at Lincoln on a sprawling airport with potentially 1200 drivers scattered throughout the Nebraska capitol/college town. Actually, COVID concerns had the pre-entry, open for a month, at only 672 when Nationals were cancelled. (The year before, the 1225 entry cap had been hit in 24 hours.)

Salina also lost its annual Smoky Hill River Festival in June, as well as the LeadSled Spectacular in July.

But Salina Region persevered. We crafted protocols, including those adopted from SCCA guidelines, to conduct our events. Masks were heavily encouraged, nitrile gloves were provided for course workers handling cones.

At our first event May 9, some unknown citizen, alarmed at our gathering, felt the need to knock on the door of a city commissioner. The city manager and parks & rec director came out to have a look. They saw us following the protocols and left us alone. We never knew they were there.

At season's end we have 23 class champions and another 14 award winners from an 11-event season that almost approached normalcy in an utterly abnormal atmosphere.

While we're happy to put 2020 in the rear-view mirror, we managed to put together a pretty good year for autocross in Salina, Kansas. 2021 may be more of the same, but now, at least, it won't be uncharted territory.



SCCA Membership notes • • •

If you are a Region-of-Record member of Salina Region, the code on your mailing label (such as RR 02-21) is your expiration date.

National membership includes a "local" region of your choice. This becomes your Region of Record. Normally your RoR is the area in which you live, but it doesn't have to be. We have members who live in other Regions' territories, and some of those regions have members who live in our territory.

You may also join as many other regions as you like, paying their local dues for the purpose of winning local championship points and participating in their programs. These are "Associate" or "Dual Region" memberships (coded A or FA). Salina Region's Associate Members are fully-vested members eligible for all our championships, voting rights, region offices and other member benefits. Associate membership only means region-of-record is elsewhere.

You <u>must</u> be a member to enter SCCA events. There are several different types of membership available, including Regular, Family, First Gear (under 25) and Military, plus short-term Trial (free) and Weekend (\$15) Memberships. Associate memberships • • •

- Associate Memberships in Salina Region expire concurrent with National and Region-of-Record memberships. All Associate memberships paid direct to Salina Region are notified to SCCA Membership and expire on their National expiration date. Associate members are fully-vested members of Salina Region, although their Region-of-Record is elsewhere.
- Annual dues are \$15.00 both for single memberships and for family memberships (which includes spouse).
- To become an Associate Member of Salina Region, contact SCCA Membership (call 1-800-770-2055) and ask to be included as a member in Salina Region. The Region's dues will be paid at that time and added to your renewal fees.
- Or, at renewal time, renew online and you will find an option to "Add Region." Scroll down to find Salina Region in the drop-down menu.
