MEETING MINUTES

(Subject to correction and approval at the next Salina Region board meeting)
The board meeting of the Salina Region SCCA was called to order at 7:10 pm Sept.
13, 2022, by RE Andlee Phengphachanh via Zoom. Also present were Sharon Brillhart,
Chandler Brown, Rocky Entriken, Aaron Loggan, Abner Perney, Dennis and Nancy
Smith.

Minutes from the previous meeting were reviewed and unanimously approved. Treasurers Report was reviewed and unanimously approved.

<u>Old Business:</u> Joint Divisional (with Kansas Region) – Oct. 8-9 registration is open on MSR. Registration ends Oct. 5. Sanctioning is completed. Still need to get Certificate of Insurance. Other assorted work is progressing.

New loaner helmets are expected to show up sometime in September. Bathrooms at Evans Field are now open after remodel!

New Business: Venue for Banquet – The Garage is expensive. In February 2022 District Eat & Play required about \$500 food service and room was free. Other potential venues were discussed. Still trying to find what is available at a reasonable price and what fits into our schedule. Need to schedule around MiDiv Convention Feb. 17-19, and National Convention is typically late January. Other weekends (Feb. 11 or 25) should be clear.

Late registration fee is now active for registration after Friday night.

Please help keep excess chit-chat out of trailer during timing and registration. Workers need to concentrate on the task at hand and this can be very distracting.

Sept. 11 event – Overall, the event went well. Short course made timing challenging (very little time between cars), and corner workers had to hustle more than usual to keep up. Aaron suggested a red light at the start line to "Hold the Start" since there was little time between cars starting and radio chatter sometimes made contacting the starter a challenge. Some Trial memberships and Minor Waivers from previous event were a bit short on information. Announcer being outside of trailer worked well. Continuing work on a few options for a remote timing screen for the announcer.

Timing lights – Require four AA and four 9v batteries. Currently waiting on batteries to die before replacing (which everyone agreed was a good approach). However, we will plan to have fresh batteries for MiDiv Championship to minimize potential delays.

2023 Board Members – Dennis and Nancy Smith intend to step down from their duties as Equipment Manager and Chief Registrar. Looking for volunteers to fill these roles. Please reach out to any of the board members if you are interested in helping out the club.

<u>Open Forum:</u> Discussion about potentially paying from Zoom commercial account to eliminate the 40-minute time limit. Doesn't seem to be a pressing need at this point. Next BOD meeting 7:00 pm Tuesday Oct. 11 via Zoom. Meeting adjourned at 8:20.

The current exhibit at The Garage, Salina's new downtown automotive museum, is race cars. Examples are on the floor from Indy Cars to Soapbox Derby. Among them are a couple of SCCA club race and autocross cars, including a certain 1964 Triumph Spitfire which has competed in 38 SCCA Solo National Championships, three Runoffs, and has raced and autocrossed throughout SCCA's Midwest Division.

Others on display include a March Indy Car raced by Al Unser, Ernie Irvan's 1991 Daytona 500 winner, a Reynard Formula Atlantic raced by Jeff Andretti, dirt trackers including sprint, midget and modified racers, a twin-engine dragster, Bonneville record-setters, an offroad buggy and Jeep, and even two characters from the movie *Cars* – an actual restored copy of "The Fabulous Hudson Hornet" NASCAR racer of the '50s done up as the Doc Hudson character next to a Miata dressed as Lightning McQueen.

The exhibit will be on display through December.

TWIN TOWERS

Jason Rash's concept for his 9/11 event was to invoke the spirit of the World Trade Center's twin towers with a mirror-image course for its outbound and inbound legs. It was a course that demanded a disciplined, deliberate, yet aggressive approach — essentially a long slalom with 28 distinct turns over a run of 35-45 sec, and only a couple of brief moments to take a breath. With a relatively short run time under an azure sky, everyone had seven tries to solve it.

Chad Stoughton in his new electric kart from Latvia was the only driver under 30 sec, setting FTD at 29.040 sec which also was good for Top PAX. It was almost five sec back to the next-quickest entry, Aaron Loggan's XA Mercedes setting Fast Fender at 34.0 sec. Loggan had a full second over third-quick Theresa Walton's ES Miata. Walton was the only driver within one second of Stoughton on index.

The closest contest was for D Street between Tim Nicholson's Subaru and Ashton King's Scion. King's faster early runs were spoiled with pylons and then Nicholson began finding clean 35s while King cleaned up his string of 36s to finish 0.627 sec behind.

The only other class contest less than one sec was Buck Entriken's STR victory in an NB Miata – stopping by again on his way home to Dallas from the SCCA Solo Nationals – to win by 0.888 sec over Allan Unruh's BMW Z4.

Slaloms tend to enhance pylon penalties. Which proved true on a day with 109 cone calls from 30 drivers. Which means everyone averaged 3½ pylons over their seven runs. Only four drivers got through the day clean and only one of those, Eric Underwood in a BS Corvette, won his class. Also completing the day cone-free were Rick Nicholson, whose 36.8 time in his DS Subaru was the quickest by a driver who never collected a cone; John Schmidt in an FS Camaro, and Michael Charest in an HS Acura.

Upcoming schedule: Busy finish to the season

MiDiv

As we seem to do every year, the end of Salina Region's autocross season will be a flurry of activity with four events across five weekends.

It begins with a doubleheader Oct. 8-9. It's the final round of the Midwest Division's Divisional Championship

Series, but at basic it is just two Salina Region autocrosses (it's also a Kansas Region doubleheader; they are co-hosting the Divisional with us and also scoring it in their regional championship).

You can enter either day for \$40, or both days for \$60.

Kansas region will do most of the organizing while we provide the site, equipment and the necessary permissions.

Two weeks later – Oct. 23 – we'll have our annual Octoberfast 33 autocross, using the same course map drawn 33 years ago by Dave and Jo Richards. The thing about the map, how it ends up on the concrete is always a little different from year to year.

It is also a celebration of Salina Region and our member appreciation event. The course was first run in the region's inaugural year. Octoberfast 33 = 33 years Salina Region has existed. To that end all Salina Region members in good standing get a free entry. You still have to pre-enter on MotorsportsReg but the entry fee is \$0.00. If you're not a member of the region, you can join on the spot and still get the free entry. If already an SCCA member elsewhere, it's only \$15 regional dues. We notify SCCA and you'd renew with your annual renewal.

Two weeks after that - Nov. 6- comes the season finale. Just a regular old autocross to wrap up the year.

Salina Region's championship rules require competitors to run at least four events during the year. So someone could join the region and qualify for the championship in this year-end swing. Or, if qualified in one class, change to a different one and try for a double championship.

Our championship also requires a competitor be a member by Sept. 30 to keep all points earned earlier in the year. On Oct. 1 all points scored to drivers who are not a member of Salina Region will be wiped off.

The customer is always right... ...except when she isn't

I've been a mechanic my entire working life so far, and this is one of my favorite experiences.

I had a customer come in complaining about a vibration. I put the vehicle on the lift and checked the front end.

I found a nearly broken tie rod and a faulty rack and pinion. So basically the passenger side front wheel was not fully secured to the steering system and would soon break and cause the wheel to be completely disconnected from the steering.

I told the customer how much the repair would be and told her it was unsafe to drive. She asked me to put it back together so she could leave. I told her that I could not do that because if it broke after I let her leave, I could be held liable. She started yelling and screaming about calling the cops and suing me and how her cousin's brother knows a guy who's related to the chief of police and I'll be arrested.

She calls the police and they come out. I show the officers the vehicle and they understood the safety concern. They told me to just put the car down and let her leave. I did and even made her sign a statement declining crucial safety repairs.

She left with the most "I told you so" smug grin on her face... until she left the property, got pulled over, and her car was impounded. They also gave her a ticket for reckless driving. —Anon



So I finally beat my brother Buck in an autocross. I managed to navigate Jason Rash's endless slalom a tenth of a second quicker than he did.

It only took me 57 years.

There's a couple of things to mention here. First, it's entirely his fault I'm in this game in the first place. Second, it's not like we run against each other every week. These days I get maybe two cracks at him a year.

It was right at 57 years ago, Sept. 5, 1965, when I was visiting my brother for two weeks. He lived then in New York City. "We're going to a gymkhana this weekend." "What's that?"

On the third Sunday I got up the courage to ask if I could drive his MGA. The event was the Virgo Autocross, by Team X, of which he was a member.

"Sure, but you won't beat anybody," he replied. The MGA was in the largest class, 21 cars in Class F. Buck finished 5th, I was 11th. I came home to Lawrence and bought my Triumph Spitfire (see Page 3) and began running events in Kansas City. I think maybe once Buck drove my car at a KC event. He beat me, of course.

You may wonder about our nicknames. I was born Robert K. Entriken Jr., but am eternally grateful dad decided I would not be "Junior" or "Little Bob." My RKE initials became Rocky. My brother came along $2\frac{1}{2}$ years later, named Edward Livingston Freeman Entriken after our maternal grandfather, but some distant uncle tagged him Bucko and it stuck.

SCCA was a minor player in the '60s. It was 1969 before I began doing Kansas Region events in Topeka (soon after I moved to Salina). In 1971 I joined SCCA.

Buck later moved to Lawrence, eventually opened his own repair shop, road racing his MGA while I was autocrossing. In 1971 I gave him my Spitfire and told him to make it into a race car. He raced it in G Production three years, took it to the Runoffs twice.

Buck raced a B Production Corvette for a year but never could keep an engine in it, had a Formula Ford that he wrapped it around a guardrail at the Ponca City GP, and decided maybe he should go back to a Spitfire. He bought another, took it to the Runoffs again, then quit the sport in 1977 when he began racing sailboats and building boat trailers. By then he'd moved to Texas.

Built By Buck, which first appeared on engine work he'd done in Lawrence, then on my Spitfire, now became his boat trailer business in Dallas. When I gave him the Spitfire I bought a new 1971 Pinto, my first new car. In 1972 SCCA created a new road racing class, Showroom Stock Sedan. The spec on my Pinto matched up (2-liter, stickshift), so I slapped a rollbar in it and went racing.

My second race, at Sunflower Aerodrome (Hutchinson), Buck was there in my Spitfire, SSS and GP running in the same race group. There was this massive puddle at the turn into the esses and they'd put a big pylon to mark the edge. As the dutiful novice I was going around the pylon in practice even as the puddle dried up, until Buck came by, passing me far on the inside, and giving me this "what're you doing way over there?" gesture. That afternoon was my first race win.

In the Spitfire I ran a season of road race in 1977, another in 1980, and then budget didn't allow again until 1995. Meanwhile I was always autocrossing while Buck was doing sailboats.

The new millennium was maybe a decade gone before Buck rediscovered cars. Miatas now. By now I'd essentially parked the Spitfire and had a Miata of my own – an automatic 1999 that had been left with a "For Sale" on it at one of our events. I needed something to teach my youngest daughter and son to autocross and that became the weapon.

In 2013 Buck drove his first Solo Nationals. I was a 100%er doing my 41st Nationals and this guy who introduced me to the sport 48 years earlier was a Nats rookie. On the second day he suggested we swap cars. Driving his stickshift NB I was 3 sec quicker than his time in my automatic (he still beat me on combined time).

A week later he calls me, "I've got your new car." Didn't ask or anything, just bought it – the 2000 NB I'm driving today. We met at an Oklahoma Region event where we finished 1-2 in a 6-car class. He won, of course.

Since then I've been trying to beat him at Nationals, been close but no cigar. Once I was quicker on Day 1, he got revenge on Day 2. When Salina Region began doing our Sunday-after-Nationals event four years ago he'd stop off on his way home to Texas and we'd have another go at it. I never caught him. Until now.

He has a fleet of seven Miatae now, the white 2001 we ran this year at Nationals in STR is his Time Trials car. So I got him when he was in a car that on paper is superior to my ES entry (he calls it his "cheater ES," which is why it's in STR).

I've had a good life in this sport, and sometimes I wonder what it would have been if not for that visit in 1965. If not for him moving to Lawrence and building my Spitfire into a race car. If not for having Buck Entriken for a brother.

Love ya, bro.
