MEETING MINUTES

(Subject to correction and approval at the next Salina Region board meeting) The Board of Directors meeting for Salina SCCA was conducted via Zoom and called to order at 7:19 pm on March 7 by R.E. Andlee Phengphachanh. Also attending were Sharon and Henry Brillhart, Chandler Brown, Rocky Entriken, Justin Gagna, Aaron Loggan, Artt Mann, Kale Morris, Monte Rans, Abner Perney, and Dennis and Nancy Smith.

Motion to approve minutes from previous meeting passed unanimously.

Treasurers Report – Sharon provided Treasurers report with an overview of the more significant expenses for the month which consisted of: Banquet space at The Garage, Hickory Hut catering, Hilton Garden Inn (MiDiv Convention). Artt moved to approve report. Kale seconded. Passed unanimously.

Kale mentioned \$25 application fee from city.

Old Business - Kale opened an account on City of Salina website to reserve the Berkley Family Recreation Area for our events. Registration fee for this was \$15. City will continue to waive fees this year, and has stated our dates are approved. City website asks for registration to be completed on Parks & Rec website as well. Rocky contacted Travis Scheele at Parts & Rec, which is good with the schedule.

Board determined last month that due to the increased expenses, including an increase in SCCA's sanction/insurance fees, we had to raise our base Registration cost to \$30 for members, \$45 non-members. This results in an increase in 2-Day event fees to \$45 for members, and FSAE registration increase to \$20. Monte (now living in Indiana) reported that Indy Region is \$35 and events at Grissom Aeroplex just increased to \$45, so we are still on the low end of the spectrum.

Antique event was brought up by Aaron. Considerable discussion, but no decision at this time.

Repaint grid/expand (Rocky) – Plan painting party for grid numbers and Mirror Khana boxes after Test and Tune on 3/18.

2023 Tech Sheet put on website and first registration (Henry). Sharon got new stickers at a cost of \$21. Cars have to meet ▶ ▶ Continued to Page 3 The Write Line March 2023 ~ Page 3



Do you want to get set for your best autocross season yet? Including, perhaps, taking on the 50th running of the SCCA Tire Rack Solo Nationals.

It's coming next month, right here in Salina, KS, at the Evolution Performance Driving School.

Three schools, actually, taught by National Champion instructors. Take just one, or all three (there are discounts if you do two or more).

Just like when you were a kid, you have to do first grade before you can do second grade. So:

- Phase 1 Friday. April 14.
- Phase 2, Saturday, April 15.
- Challenge School, Sunday, April 16.

To sign up, look on MotorsportsReg.com for "Evolution Weekend with Salina Region SCCA."

Cost of one school is \$275. But there are discounts for taking multiple schools. Two-driver cars are welcome.

Cost of two schools is \$520 – save \$30.

Cost of three schools is \$750 – save \$75.

EVOLUTION PHASE 1 – This is the first step in autocross education where all students start. The daylong course builds students skills level via introducing new ideas to improve one's times. Students both ride and drive (using their own cars) with Evolution's trained, professional drivers (most of which are current or past National Solo Champions) to learn where they are fast and where they need to improve. Small student teacher ratio of 2:1 insures quality instruction time. **EVOLUTION PHASE 2** – Building upon the skills learned in Phase 1, the Phase 2 school takes the driver into new areas of mental race preparation, allowing the Phase 1 skills to be applied as second nature. Various driving exercises are conducted throughout the day to improve the driver's visual and mental imaging of the course, resulting in quicker lap times. Phase 2 students must first have completed Phase 1. **EVOLUTION CHALLENGE** – The Challenge School forces students to combine everything they have previously learned, but on a longer, quicker, national style, real world autocross course, complete with quick slaloms and hard "shut downs." Our goal is to drive home the Phase 1 and Phase 2 concepts and make sure you still are using them while increasing the length of time on course. In addition, you will receive instant feedback and one on one training, this time from a slightly different perspective. This school has different meaning for every person that takes it. Come with an open mind and the willingness to try things you normally would have left at home. We want everyone to drive at 10/10ths and we will encourage it!!

STAY FROSTY

It was indeed a frosty weekend for our annual test & tune on Saturday and season-opener autocross on Sunday. Normally the mid-March date is cool but nice. This year it was 17° when Dennis Smith rolled the trailer in and Andlee Phengphachanh began to set up his T&T course. The northwest wind didn't help. Yet a dozen or so hardy souls came to get some laps in.

Sunday, Andlee extended his course further south. The overnight low had dropped to 11° but the wind had shifted to the south-southwest and sunrise brought something resembling warmth. The first heat ran in above-freezing 30s and by Heat 2 the temps reached tolerable 40s.

Competition ensued for 26 drivers, the closest coming at the top of the chart in A Street, in the warmer second heat, between Phelan Gagnon's Corvette ripping off six clean runs and Mason Libby's Saturn Sky perhaps trying a little too hard with three DNFs, including his first run while Gagnon opened at 52.9, Libby took the lead with a 52.4 on his second try, Gagnon ran 52.1 on his third while Libby posted two more DNFs. It was Libby's turn again with a 49.9 fifth run. On the final try Gagnon's 49.574 was just 0.208 quicker than Libby's last look.

Two classes produced a four-car contest, including the all-Mustang CAM·C where Justin Gagna's 50.204 outran Tyler Lamia by 0.306 sec. In G Street Philip and Collin Meredith shared a Volkswagen GTI for a 1-2 finish, and Philip set Top PAX with a 46.782.

The frigid first heat produced no grip (in an ES Miata I spun the tires clear to the first slalom cone!) and yet Aaron Loggan, first car out, was still able to post FTD at 46.479. Philip Meredith was just a couple of cars behind him setting Top PAX.

Four drivers found a run in the 46-sec range, two in each heat. Jacob Orlowski won STH at 46.4 and Kale Morris won XB at 46.9, both in Heat 2. Fast Lady fell to Sharon Brillhart's ESL Toyota MR2 at 49.750.

'23 Solo Nats Homecoming to enrich spectacular Solo season

The new year means a new season of SCCA autocross, and if you've ever thought you wanted to jump in, this is the time to do it. Heck, if you've ever competed in an autocross, this is the year to do it more.

Why this year in particular? Because 2023 marks the momentous 50th running of the Tire Rack SCCA Solo National Championships, taking place Sept. 4-8, 2023, at Lincoln Airpark in Nebraska's capital city, and you're invited for the most spectacular of homecomings – hence the fantastic logo in the image sitting alongside this text. But the logo is just the first hint of what's lined up for 2023.

Before you can attend the 2023 Tire Rack Solo National Championships, you need to get there, and for that, there's the 2023 National Solo season. Between notable enhancements to the Tire Rack Solo National Tour and Tire Rack ProSolo Series, not to mention the addition of XS to the CAM Challenge, this year's National Solo season is poised to deliver heaping good times you can't afford to miss.

Homecoming Celebration

While the National Solo season kicked off on Feb. 24 (more about that momentarily), let's jump to September and the 50th running of the Tire Rack SCCA Solo National Championships. There's a lot planned for this massive event, including a welcome party unlike any other hosted at a special location you won't want to miss. And being that this is a homecoming celebration, expect to see new faces, competitors returning for a comeback, and tailgating throughout the 1300-driver paddock.



What else? Awesome out-of-the-norm vehicles will be on site, as Heritage classes will be welcomed to the Solo National Championships as Supplemental classes, offering drivers a chance to dust off machinery that may no longer be competitive. Drivers are also encouraged to wheel out other Heritage-type cars to compete in during the Solo National Tours and Solo National Championships – basically, everyone wants to check out your classic ride, so show it off.

Chasing Points

Like in 2022, those competing in the Tire Rack Solo National Tour will earn points toward a season title. For 2023, drivers competing for that season-long title must compete in at least three Solo National Tour events all in the same class – just like before. But this year, the Tire Rack Solo National Championships will also count in that points total. Also new for 2023 is that Solo National Tours taking place after the Tire Rack Solo National Championships will count in the points race, including a new event in Frederick, OK.

You can use digital membership cards now

Did you know you can now keep your SCCA membership card on your phone and sign the annual waiver digitally? Both can be found at my.scca.com, the same location members can go to renew their annual SCCA membership and more online!

Digital membership cards are now accepted at all SCCA events as proof of membership, and contain the same look and information as the plastic cards many of us currently carry everywhere. But the biggest change is to the annual waiver. While previous versions required a wet signature and paper mailed to the SCCA office, the new process holds the same legality and takes less than five minutes to complete.


Signing the annual waiver requires only a log in and a digital photo (no hats, sunglasses or masks, please – and a photo of YOU, not your car!) to complete. The digital waiver and membership cards are good for both adults and minors – parents will, of course, still be required to sign the digital form for their children.

Though the digital cards and waivers were designed with member convenience in mind, they are not required. Both digital and physical hard cards will be accepted at event registration, and those who choose not to sign the digital waiver will be able to sign a paper waiver on site or submit the annual waiver as in the past.


Here's the FTD times the past few years (or FFTD if we had Mod cars) – no event in 2020, COVID y'know, Compared to our FTDs at our March and May events:


Problem is, someone says "short course" and people don't want to come. Look at the times above and people are getting just as much seat time, maybe more if it's a six-run day. And averages of our April events against the March/May events? The two-lap FTDs averaged 49.538 sec while the "full-size" courses in March and May averaged 46.630 sec. And the event we just ran the FTD was 46.479.

I always enjoy the doubleheader. It's the only time of the year I get that off-camber downhill over-the-hump turnaround, which is a difficult turn I have to do twice in each run to get a good time. The whole site is also a steeper grade.


But mostly, we are running on a site other regions would kill for. Here's a few course maps other regions are using. You'll notice most of the courses use repeated sections.




Big Island of Hawaii Region -- FTD 52.405




Delta Region (Louisiana) - FTD 36.465

These are "Associate" or "Dual Region" memberships. - Associate Memberships in Salina Region expire concurrent with National and Region-of-Record memberships. All Associate memberships paid direct to Salina Region are notified to SCCA Membership and expire on their National expiration date. Associate members are fully-vested members of Salina Region, although their Region-of-Record is elsewhere.
- Annual dues are \$15.00 both for single memberships and for family memberships (which includes spouse and children age 20 and younger).
- To become an Associate Member of Salina Region, contact SCCA Membership (call 1-800-770-2055) and ask to be included as a member in Salina Region. The Region's dues will be paid at that time and added to your renewal fees.
