The KSU FSAE team will repair our broken timing antenna.

THERESA!

It was an historic occasion at the 50th Running of the SCCA Solo Nationals – Salina Region gained its first-ever Region-of-Record National Champion.

Theresa Walton, competing in a 10-car E Street Ladies class (tied for third largest Ladies class), was utterly dominant in winning her championship by 3.709 sec over 20-time champion Karen Babb.

Consistency won the title for Walton – consistently quick. She set fast time on both courses with a two-brand tire strategy, starting on Bridgestones each day then doing her final run on Yokohamas, considered superior without tire heat. It was that or having to manually scrape OPR* off her tires for third runs (*Other People's Rubber).

Thursday Walton was quickest at 59.108 sec (on the 'Stones) on the very busy West Course, 1.165 sec ahead of Dawn Danton from Northwest Region. Friday on the East Course (designed by Babb), on the Yokes, she turned 68.063 to outrun Emily Skoglund of St. Louis Region by 0.707 sec. Babb was 3rd on Thursday, 5th on Friday, but second on aggregate.

Walton was also 10th out of 64 drivers in the overall Ladies class PAX Index.

Twenty Salina Region members competed, including dual member **Mason Herrick**, Scion FR-S, who won a 67-car Solo Spec Coupe class for a second time after five prior championships in Junior Karts before SCCA disbanded that program.

On the weekend after the SCCA Solo Nationals, Abner Perney gave us a workout. You want slaloms? You got slaloms!! Counting the two Chicago boxes, you might count seven of them, maybe eight.

With 36 drivers taking six runs each (two drivers skipping their final run), that was 214 passes through the cones and 107 taking a hit, averaging one pylon penalty for every other run. Only three drivers managed a clean day, no cones or DNFs – Ann LaRandeau in a DSL Toyota GR Corolla, Kemper Wedel in an STS Miata, and Ethan Gibbs in a CAM·C Mustang GT.

Mike Herrick, Civic Si, was the only competitor able to finish the course in less than one minute, and he did it four times but his third-run 59.398 was his best. He coned two faster runs including a 58.8. His runs also held up for Top PAX.

With all that there was just one class decided by less than a minute, the D Street contest between John LaRandeau's GR and Ashton King's Scion FR-S. King DNF'd his first two runs but it took LaRandeau three runs to get down to 64. King's fourth try was a qui8cker 64 but then LaRandeau found a 63.2 on his fifth. He passed on his final leaving the door open for King, who finished with a 64.1, 0.908 sec behind.

Fast Lady was a duel between two femmes in E Street cars. In the first heat, ES winner Theresa Walton could only get one clean run in her Miata, whacking eight cones but coming home clean on her 5th try at 63.7. In the second heat Sharon Brillhart ran her Toyota in ESL and also was a bit cone-happy, totaling five, but run #4 was clean at 63.395 for Fast Lady, 0.309 sec quicker than Walton.

After Herrick, AS winner Mason Libby, Saturn Sky Redline, was second quickest and still 2½ sec back, the only driver to score a 61-sec run. Then the clock stopped in the high 62s for SM winner Adam Blunck, Subaru Impreza WRX, and FS winner Steve Wright, Camaro SS, followed by four drivers in the 63-sec range.

Well that was quite a week!

The 50th Running of the SCCA Solo Nationals in Lincoln, NE, dubbed "Homecoming," was in many ways unlike any other but in other ways very much like those of recent experience.

Had it not been for COVID, which cancelled the event in 2020, last year would have technically been the 50th

anniversary. So now we celebrate the 50th Running, and so on.

For those of us in the adjacent photo, we are not really a threat any more. But since 2010, when the 100%ers became seven, we've just been trying to get to this year. It'll be another four or five years before anybody else can join our newly

created Golden Circle, provided they don't miss any years until then.

A highlight for Salina Region was Theresa Walton's ESL championship. We've had champions before, such as Mason Herrick and Ron Williams, but they have all been Associate members, holding Region of Record status in neighboring regions leaving Salina Region blank in the "Solo Stats" record book I produced every year. Now we have our own entry.

It took 33 years for Salina Region to honor a local champion. I cannot help the realization that when I joined SCCA in 1971 the club wasn't even that old. Founded in 1944, it was 27 years old when it added me as a member.

The Golden Circle was announced at the Monday night welcome party. Although we all knew it was coming, it caught us by surprise since we expected it at Wednesday's awards night. But we were all there at the time and it turned out a cool thing since on Wednesday we'd have been second best to recipients of the Solo Cup, Driver of Eminence, and other significant solo awards plus the winners of the first two days' of competition. Monday we were the stars of the show, the only award recipients on the stage.

The final entry count, according to the official results, was 1296 drivers. Not a record because in 2018 they tried to stuff 1400 drivers (it ended up 1375) through the courses and learned the hard way that was just too much. At one point this year I saw 1320 on the MotorsportsReg entry list, and the waitlist was nearly 200 early on. At the end, most waitlisters made it in but there were still 40 who didn't make it.

Realize that back on June 29, when the entry opened, it hit the cap of 1300 drivers in four hours!

It was a significant year for me for another reason, too. Because of the 50th, they had this little "pop-up museum" in a building adjacent to the paddock. They asked me to bring my Triumph Spitfire to display there. It was the first

car you saw when you walked in the door. Right behind it was Don Knop's Shelby GT350. Don is also a Salina member (but RoR in the Nebraska Region).

I didn't bring the Spitfire home. On Saturday morning, after all was done, we delivered it to the Speedway Motors Museum of American Speed where eventually it

will join a display of SCCA competition cars.

Speedway Motors, if you aren't familiar, is one of the largest purveyors of parts and pieces for race cars (there's a brake line on my Spitfire they made for me when mine sprung a leak during an earlier Solo Nationals). The warehouse there goes on forever. On the other side of the parking lot is the three-story museum encompassing displays from early-day Indy and Sprint cars to race-themed toys. They just received the Unser family collection and are currently building an addition to feature the SCCA display.

I didn't bring the Miata home either! Yes, my brother Buck and I ran it in Lincoln and again at our local event, but then it went back up on his trailer to go to his compound east of Dallas. A wheel bearing needs attention among other things.

Turns out when I got the stickshift 2000 car and sold off the previous 1999 automatic, and swapped off the "good" suspension pieces from the '99 (Koni yellow shocks, Racing Beat swaybar), I also gave away the good "Hard-R" springs. Who knew?

Which means I need a ride for our last two events. I'm open to offers, an E Street car preferred.

- Associate Memberships in Salina Region expire concurrent with National and Region-of-Record memberships. All Associate memberships paid direct to Salina Region are notified to SCCA Membership and expire on their National expiration date. Associate members are fully-vested members of Salina Region, although their Region-of-Record is elsewhere.
- Annual dues are \$15.00 both for single memberships and for family memberships (which includes spouse and children age 20 and younger).
- To become an Associate Member of Salina Region, contact SCCA Membership (call 1-800-770-2055) and ask to be included as a member in Salina Region. The Region's dues will be paid at that time and added to your renewal fees.
- Or, at renewal time, renew online and you will find an option to "Add Region." Scroll down to find Salina Region in the drop-down menu.
- If you choose to pay dues direct to Salina Region (for example, at an event), we will notify SCCA and your Salina Region membership will become part of your National membership renewal.
- Mailed subscriptions are available to non-members, \$15 for the calendar year.
