Artt moved to approve minutes as presented. Andlee seconded. Approved. Chandler moved to approve treasurer's report as presented. Artt seconded. Approved.

Old Business – <u>Fire extinguishers:</u> Serviced and in Rocky's van. Will bring them to first event on March 16.

<u>Cones:</u> Waiting to network at MiDiv Convention Feb. 24 to try to get a larger group order. Ongoing discussion about the desire to purchase some cheap cones for barrier use.

Autocross Myths and Facts

Found on Arkansas Region's Facebook page

As long-time members and autocrossers, we've heard a lot of misguided assumptions about our events, or autocross in general, that might dissuade new folks from coming out and participating, so here we will address a few of them.

Myth: "I won't have fun because my car wouldn't be competitive."

Fact: First of all, having fun and being competitive have little to do with each other. For most of us, having fun with cars and friends is the primary reason for coming out. Second of all, the car you bring is only a small factor in determining how fast you'll be.

Myth: "Points events are intended more for the serious guys and gals."

Fact: Whether points are at stake or not, most of us are there for fun with cars.

Myth: "Non-points events or Test 'n Tune events are better for novices and casual drivers"

Fact: ALL local events are good for novices and casual drivers. Most of us are not super serious, but even the few of us who are chasing points will go out of our way to encourage and help the newer folks.

Myth: "A school is the only way to get driving tips or in-car instruction."

Fact: Ride-alongs are allowed and encouraged at all our events and all of us are willing to offer some sort of advice. Just find a fast guy/gal and ask — perhaps at lunch and not as they're pulling out of grid :

Myth: "I need to get sticky tires or modify my car before starting/My car isn't set up for it."

Fact: Autocross is more about the driver than the car. Seat time is the most important mod. Street classes exist. Satisfaction and raw times are not directly correlated. We usually advise NOT to start throwing money at the car to start. Street classes don't allow much beyond tires and shocks and maybe an aggressive alignment (but not even springs or suspension changes are permitted). Before that just learn the techniques solo will teach you. You'll learn more with a bone-stock vehicle. First, tighten the nut behind the wheel.

Keep in mind, the prime directive is **#FunWithCars**.

Okay, I'm old. No escaping that. 83rd birthday this month. I still have no intention of acting my age. I hope that as long as I can still push a gas pedal and SCCA lets me renew my membership, I'll keep doing this silliness.

Saw my cardiologist last week. He says I'm healthier than I was a year ago, next appointment is a year away, not six months like the last few. I was wearing my "AX Murderer" T-shirt, showing the corpse outlines of three dead pylons. The doc laughed.

Been a funny month. Appointments with every regular doctor I have. Mostly coincidence, just regular checkups. Except that wouldn't be true if this wasn't a leap year. Feb 29 is when I see my eye doc, for a follow-up after cataract surgery (left eye last month, right eye early this month). Easiest surgery I ever had. On the table at noon, headed home at 1:30. No bandages, no trauma, just eyedrops for a couple of weeks. Maybe I'll get closer to the cones now.

The Miata is getting some off-season surgery too, courtesy of my brother, Buck. After Nationals (and our Sept. 10 event) he loaded it on his trailer and hauled it home to Terrell TX, east of Dallas, to fix a few issues. In the process he found a few more, some of which we suspect existed before he bought it in the first place.

One issue I'd done to myself because I didn't know any better. The car was originally a "Hard R" which meant among its attributes were stiffer springs. Originally I had a '99 automatic NB Miata which I'd fitted with Koni yellow shocks and a Racing Beat swaybar. When I got the 2000 NB, I had those swapped over — only to learn the cost of the swap between the two cars probably cost the same as if I'd just bought new Konis and a new swaybar for the '00.

In the process, since I didn't know to tell the local mechanic anything different, when the Konis went to my "new" car, so did the springs mounted around them, and the Hard-R springs went to the automatic! <sigh> When Buck co-drove mine last September in Lincoln, that's when we discovered my swap goof.

Well, Buck has this airplane hangar he built in his

back yard (he lives on a country road) with, at last count, some seven Miatae in it not counting mine. One is a Spec Miata racer that was originally a "Hard-R" car but now has the Spec Miata suspension, so I'm getting those springs.

That was the original reason for taking it to Texas. Since then he's found the reason I keep replacing rear hub bearings – the hole it went into wasn't round! It was probably that way when he bought it. Nobody who replaced the bearings had any reason to measure it, but Buck is picky that way. He says it was about 0.020" out of round. He ended up getting a whole new corner from Mazdaspeed to hang on the car.

Buck says now my Miata ought to be as good as Theresa Walton's! Oh boy. Maybe now I'll only be 4 seconds behind her instead of 5 sec.

Yeah, this gettin' old stuff kinda sucks, but it still beats the alternative. Actually 2023 has been a good year for me (except for July – fender bender, gallstone attack, car part spammers). It starts with receiving the SCCA's top two recognitions – the Woolf Barnato Award and induction into the Hall of Fame – an unprecedented twofer, and finishes up with the Golden Circle Award for the seven of us who have competed in all 50 of the Solo Nationals to date.

It was also still 2023 in December when I got to tape an introduction (played during the National Convention last month) of the next Woolf Barnato recipient, SportsCar publisher Paul Pfanner. Having written for the magazine since 1972, that was a special privilege and pleasure. I'll be on the committee with Paul for the next two years (with Rich Bireta in Topeka for one more) to select the next recipients.

The last event was nothing to write home about. Theresa graciously offered a co-drive in her National Champion car and I thoroughly embarrassed myself, or would have if I still didn't have fun in the effort. Which I did. It was a privilege to share her ride. Since My car was in Texas I skipped Octoberfast to shoot pictures of everyone else, and when she saw I wasn't driving she ran over to offer me her car. I deferred to November (when I hit nine cones!).

I guess that's just one example of why I keep doing this. Oddly enough, I've never been that mechanically inclined. I don't really enjoy tinkering. I can disassemble major pieces on my Spitfire after owning it 50+ years – it's now on display at the Speedway Motors Museum of American Speed in Lincoln, NE – but the technical stuff I leave to the pros. But friends like Theresa and my brother keep me behind the wheel, which is the thing about cars I enjoy the most.

It's too easy now not to get one done. No paper form, no notarized signature, do it all online. **And it's FREE!** Enter an event through MotorsportsReg.com, the fact you have an Annual Waiver on file pops up automatically in the MSR info sent to the registrar.


How easy? Go to your Member Account Portal on SCCA.com. If you haven't done that before, the click-in is a red bar near the top of SCCA's home page.

Once you've logged in, under "Online Store" click on "Licenses & Waivers." The top item is Annual Waiver Adult. Click Add to Cart. A copy of your waiver pops up, already all filled out. You just click the checkbox that you've read and understood this legal document and you have electronically "signed" it.

Next it will ask you for a selfie photo (no helmet, mask or sunglasses, and not a photo of your car).

That's basically it. Easy. SCCA will "review it" – mostly just checking to verify your membership is current and your photo meets spec. You'll get an immediate email that they have it, and another within 24 hours that you're good to go.

Just remember that all Annual Waivers expire on Dec. 31 (not with your membership renewal). You'll do it again next year.

National membership includes a "local" region of your choice. This becomes your Region of Record. Normally your RoR is the area in which you live, but it doesn't have to be. We have members who live in other Regions' territories, and some of those regions have members who live in our territory.

You may also join as many other regions as you like, paying their local dues for the purpose of winning local championship points and participating in their programs. These are "Associate" or "Dual Region" memberships. Salina Region's Associate Members are fully-vested members eligible for all our championships, voting rights, region offices and other member benefits. "Associate" membership only means region-of-record is elsewhere.

You <u>must</u> be a member to enter SCCA events. There are several different types of membership available, including Regular, Family, First Gear (under 25) and Military, plus short-term Trial (free) and Weekend (\$15) Memberships. Questions? • • • Associate memberships • • •

- Associate Memberships in Salina Region expire concurrent with National and Region-of-Record memberships. Any Associate memberships paid direct to Salina Region are notified to SCCA Membership and expire on their National expiration date. Associate members are fully-vested members of Salina Region, although their Region-of-Record is elsewhere.
- Annual dues are \$15.00 both for single memberships and for family memberships (which includes spouse and children age 20 and younger).
- To become an Associate Member of Salina Region, contact SCCA Membership (call 1-800-770-2055) and ask to be included as a member in Salina Region. The Region's dues will be paid at that time and added to your renewal fees.
- Or, at renewal time, renew online and you will find an option to "Add Region." Scroll down to find Salina Region in the drop-down menu.
- If you choose to pay dues direct to Salina Region (for example, at an event), we will notify SCCA and your Salina Region membership will become part of your National membership renewal.
- Mailed subscriptions are available to non-members, \$15 for the calendar year.

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
